White Rose Maths – Time, Building 9 and 10, Explore 3D shapes, to 20 and beyond. Explore different representations of 9 and 10, stories, different arrangements, songs, comparisons, subitise to 10, 3D shapes & their properties, rotating & manipulating, spatial reasoning, building & construction, composing & decomposing shapes, which shapes make other shapes, 2D & 3D shape sin the environment, patterns & patterns in the environment.

## Literacy

World Book Day – Books by Oliver Jeffers

Focus books – Goldilocks & the Three Bears, Jack & the Beanstalk, Little Red Riding Hood, The Three billy Goats Gruff, The Elves & the Shoemaker & The Three Little Pigs.
