<u>Literacy</u>

Focus books – Mad about Minibeasts, The Bad Tempered Ladybird, The Very Hungry Caterpillar, What the Ladybird Heard, What the Ladybird Heard Next & Non-fiction books.

Learn how books work – front, back, page, page numbers, pictures, characters, events & structure. Sharing books in reading area or outdoor area & 1:1 reading.

Learn & retell a story about minibeasts as a whole class activity.

During structured play children will have free access to a wide variety of writing tools and mark making materials e.g., pencils, pens, crayons, markers, whiteboard, chalk, magnetic letters, and boards.

Funky Fingers hand and finger exercises such – threading, playdough, tweezers, hammering <u>Phonics</u>
